Web Accessibility Information Card Accessible Video

Caption all audio content

Captions help people who are deaf or hard of hearing understand audio and video

Have a text transcript

Transcripts benefit many people and provide a convenient way to understand a video without having to watch

Make sure the video doesn't flash repeatedly

Video content that flashes or has repeating bold patterns can cause seizures in people who are photosensitive

Have a separate audio description

Describing what is happening in a video can be just as important as the dialogue

Use technology that's backwards compatible

People may not have the latest browsers which may affect the video player in use, so don't rely on advanced features

Do not autoplay videos

Videos which automatically play when the page loads are disruptive for all people

Video controls are keyboard friendly


Accessible video content can be affected by being played on an inaccessible video player





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
